

Shoulder and Knee Ultrasound - Medicare Criteria

The Government has rules which apply to rebates for shoulder and knee Ultrasound examinations. Medicare will only provide a rebate when the request form specifically includes one of the following suspected pathologies:

Shoulder Ultrasound Knee Ultrasound Benefits are payable when referred with suspicion of Benefits are payable when referred with the following clinical conditions: suspicion of the following clinical conditions: • Evaluation of injury to tendon, muscle Abnormality of tendons or bursae about the or tendon/muscle junction including tears, calcification or tendinosis Meniscal cyst, popliteal fossa cyst, mass or Rotator cuff tear/ calcification/ pseudomass tendinosis of biceps, subscapular, Nerve entrapment, nerve or nerve sheath supraspinatus or infraspinatus tumour Biceps subluxation Injury of collateral ligaments Capsulitis and bursitis Benefits **are not** payable when referred for non- Evaluation of mass, including specific knee pain alone or other knee conditions, **Ganglion Occult fracture** including: Acromioclavicular joint pathology Meniscal and cruciate ligament tears Benefits **are not** payable when referred for Assessment of chondral surfaces non-specific shoulder pain alone.

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
